Subdivision and Development Appeal Board

The Subdivision and Development Appeal Board, consisting of up to five Citizen Representatives, hears appeals from citizens affected by the decision of the Development Authority and/or the Subdivision Authority under the Land Use Bylaw. This is a joint appointment to the Licensing and Community Standards Board, the Review Board, and the Administrative Penalties Board.

Licensing and Community Standards Board

The Licensing and Community Standards Board hears and makes decisions on appeals for which it is responsible under any City bylaw, and in particular, arising under the following bylaws:

- Business License Bylaw
- Chicken Bylaw
- Community Standards Bylaw
- Dog Bylaw
- Escort Services Bylaw
- Firearms Bylaw
- Land Use Bylaw
- Utility Bylaw

The Review Board

Under s. 203 of the Municipal Government Act (MGA), the Review Board is given the authority of Council in respect of applications for review arising under s. 547 of the MGA.

Administrative Penalties Board

The Administrative Penalties Board is the panel responsible to determine appeals of inspector's notices, local authority's notices and debt recovery notices under the Weed Control Act, and is the committee responsible for hearing and reviewing appeals in accordance with the Agricultural Pests Act.
