COMMUNITY AMENITIES REPORT

As The City moved into preparation for the 2015 Capital Budget, Council was presented with a number of questions related to amenities and how to consult with the community in consideration of these questions. Red Deer was in the process of bidding for the 2019 Canada Winter Games which, if successful, would require significant capital investment. The question of aquatics infrastructure came before Council a number of times resulting in multiple resolutions requiring public input. Lastly, Council had set a strategic direction through the Dialogue Charter to move towards a more purposeful and diverse public consultation process.

With these considerations before Council, administration developed a multi-phased process that would capture input from Council, the community and administration. The intent was to assist Council's decision making regarding what amenities should be included in the 2015 Capital Budget and beyond.

PUBLIC CONSULTATION PROCESS

In March 2014, Administration presented a public consultation process to Council that would seek feedback from the public in three distinct phases – a development phase, a prioritization phase and a confirmation phase. Each phase asked the public in different ways and in diverse venues to identify what amenities they would like to see in our community. The process was endorsed by Council on March 14, 2014.



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DEVELOPMENT

APRIL 12, 2014 - LET'S TALK PUBLIC ONLINE SURVEY

The first phase of the process began with an amenity list created from items approved in the existing 2014 Capital Budget – Ten Year Capital Plan. This provided an initial list of amenities to examine as the process moved into future phases and the public began providing input to the process. (pages 12 and 13 of the Community Amenities Appendix).

Residents were then invited to attend Let's Talk on April 12, 2014 at Parkland Mall. A visual display was provided to residents and they were asked, "What amenities do you think are missing in our community?" This was an open ended question that provided residents the opportunity to contribute any amenity they thought was missing in the community.

This visual display and question was replicated online through a survey and promoted through The City's website and the local media. The survey was open to resident response from April 12-30, 2014.

Residents also provided input on what geographic quadrant of the city they would like to see these amenities (NE, NW, SE or SW). This information was collated and provided as data on where residents might like to see particular amenities.

Based on resident input both at Let's Talk and online, a list of 135 amenities was compiled including respondent's geographic preference related to each of the amenities. All data from residents was considered. Items such as restaurants, hospitals or schools that are outside the mandate of the municipality were considered out of scope and taken off the list. All other items were included on the list and moved forward to the prioritization phase. (pages 14-72 of the Community Amenities Appendix)

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PRIORITIZATION

MAY 21, 2014 • BUDGET OPEN HOUSE PUBLIC ONLINE SURVEY

On May 21, 2014 data gathered in the development phase was presented at the Budget Open House. During this open house the public was invited to prioritize the 135 amenities identified in the previous consultation. Residents could contribute to this process while attending the Budget Open House or participate in the same prioritization process online.

While we asked residents to prioritize the amenities, we also asked them what criteria were important for Council to consider when making amenity related budget decisions. The criteria for consideration at the open house and online were; social investment/community benefit, economic opportunity, amenity utilization, financial viability, community voice, amenity geography, and development timing. (pages 48, 79-86 of the Community Amenities Appendix)

This information was collected from both the open house and online, complied and presented to Council.

CONFIRMATION

SEPTEMBER 2014 • COUNCIL REVIEW STATISTICALLY ACCURATE RESIDENT SURVEY

The previous phases gathered data from a variety of sources for City Council's consideration. This included information from the community consultations, recommendations from the Aquatic Ad Hoc Committee, the amenity requirements to host the 2019 Canada Winter Games, the statistically accurate community survey data from Bannister Research and the prioritized decision making criteria. All this information was further filtered to determine an amenity list that reflected the community priorities (community voice) and alignment with the financial (financial viability) and timing (development timing) realities for the 2015 Capital budget and beyond.

Based on Council input and direction, months of research, review and community involvement, The City of Red Deer compiled a list of prioritized community amenities. This list will serve to guide Council as they consider the many factors in their deliberations and development of the 2015 Capital Budget. (pages 73-78 of the Community Amenities Appendix)

THE FILTER APPROACH COMPILING COMMUNITY FEEDBACK

Once the community participated in Phase 1: Development and Phase 2: Prioritization, the list of amenities was provided to Council. Using the criteria of Social Investment/Community Benefit, Economic Opportunity and Amenity Utilization, Council began to further filter the amenity list.

This completed filtering process, including Council review formed the 'Your Voice' list. (pages 8-10).

Administration was provided the 'Your Voice' list for further review using the criteria of Strategic Alignment, Development Timing and Amenity Geography. This final list formed the administrative recommendation for the 10 Year Capital Plan.

Council will review this plan and over the coming months develop a final priority list for amenities.



RESULTS

After completing the three phases of the community consultation process and Council review, the City of Red Deer compiled the following list of community amenities.

This list provides guidance for future development of a wide range of amenities.





Currently it is too early to justify LRT, but it may some day become a reality, and new land allocations should possibly reflect this, with unused or reallocatable sections along future lines. Additionally, it would be wonderful to see ANY speed passenger rail service to Edmonton and Calgary, but of course I do not expect Red Deer to foot the entire bill for this - just offering general ideas on what could help in coming decades."

AQUATIC AD-HOC COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATIONS:

Over the past decade there has been considerable discussion about the value of incorporating an indoor 50-metre multi-use pool into the inventory of recreation facilities. The Red Deer Multi-Use Aquatic Centre Ad Hoc Committee was formed to review essential information and make recommendations to City Council regarding the proposed aquatic facility. The Committee chose the four principles of Accessibility, Fiscal Responsibility, Community-Focused, and Sustainability as lenses for their discussions and decision-making processes. Based on information that is currently available, the Committee passed resolutions on guiding principles, amenities, dive tank, LEED, site, cost estimate, and aquatic standards, and recommendations were made regarding construction phasing and the future of the Michener Centre as an aquatic facility.

These resolutions and recommendations were submitted for Council's consideration to inform the Community Amenity Plan and the 2015-2024 Capital Budget Plan.

REPORT DETAILS

BACKGROUND:

During the 2014 Capital Budget debate, Council approved a resolution in which administration and council develop and undertake an engagement process about the Aquatic Centre with the community. November 26, 2013 Council Resolution:

Whereas Red Deerians have envisioned and have been working together for decades to become a destination for sports tourism in Alberta and Western Canada, and

Whereas throughout the past number of years Red Deer City Council and administration have heard repeatedly from the community the desire for an aquatics centre with a 53 meter pool that would allow Red Deer to host national and international competitions, and

Whereas 80 percent of Albertans live within two hours travel by vehicle from Red Deer which affords us an ideal host location, and

Whereas the population of Red Deer is increasing by 3% a year, and will reach nearly 150,000 by 2027 (the earliest year a centre could be completed with our current plan), and

Whereas the economic benefit for Red Deer and the region of a facility that allows Central Alberta to host national and

international competitions will have a substantial influence on the hospitality and tourism industries, as well as broaden our economic base, and

Whereas the facility will provide recreational opportunities for seniors, youth, and families and deepens the quality of life in Red Deer, and

Whereas this facility would provide quality training facilities for future aquatic athletes, and

Whereas Red Deer has a history of excellence, forward-looking leadership, and has a "can-do" attitude - citizens tell us to figure out how to make things happens, not to find reasons why things can't be done,

Therefore be it resolved that administration and council develop and undertake an engagement process about the Aquatic Centre with the community which explores both the benefits and issues — social, economic and operational, and

Be it further resolved that The City of Red Deer create an ad hoc committee, early in 2014, consisting of members of the Aquatics Centre, the general public, as well as other orders government, to further develop and determine the phasing of an aquatics centre with the Central Alberta Aquatic Centre and to explore grants, major sponsorships, and fundraising strategies; and

Be it further resolved a report come back to Council by October 2014, for Council to make a determination about the phased construction of an aquatics centre and its placement in the capital plan.

The Recreation Parks & Culture Manager acted as a liaison to the committee. City staff attended the meetings as required to provide support and information to the Committee. Upon consent of the Committee, a Facilitator (Darlene Wilson) was engaged to maximize the efficiency of the Committee process given the timeline and necessary deliverables.

Over the past nine weeks, the Committee has met 10 times, totaling more than thirty hours.

DISCUSSION:

As per the Terms of Reference, the Committee began its work with an extensive orientation. This orientation included the review of a number of City Planning documents and other relevant studies and information, a presentation by the Central Alberta Aquatic Committee, and a presentation by MTA + MJMA Architects and Associates (2011 Red Deer Multi-Use Aquatic Centre reports). The purpose of this orientation was to ensure that all committee members shared a common understanding and knowledge of the base subject.

The committee then developed a set of principles that would help guide their decisions. These principles included: Accessibility, Fiscal Responsibility, Community Focused and Sustainable.

These principles were then applied to the decision making process for identifying the included amenities and location identification, as well was the discussions related to the outdoor pool and future of Michener Centre in the provision of aquatic services for the city.

The attached report provides a summary of the committees work and discussions including additional comments for Council consideration.

ANALYSIS:

The Red Deer Multi-Use Aquatic Centre Review Ad Hoc Committee respectfully submits the following resolutions for Councils information and consideration to inform the community amenity plan and 2015-2024 Capital Budget Plan:

- I."Resolved that the Red Deer Multi-Use Aquatic Centre Review Ad Hoc Committee, having discussed amenities to be included in a multi-use aquatic facility, hereby endorses a multi-use aquatic centre in Red Deer to include the following amenities:
 - ten lane pool (54 metres), with two bulkheads
 - hot tub
 - · moveable floor
 - outdoor leisure pool (25 metres)
 - childcare area
 - retail space
 - · concession space
 - wellness area
 - flexible meeting space
 - multi-purpose room
 - swim club space
 - · timekeeping space
 - sauna/steam room
 - spectator seating
 - sunbathing terrace
- 2. "Resolved that the Red Deer Multi-Use Aquatic Centre Review Ad Hoc Committee, having discussed amenities to be included in a multi-use aquatic facility, hereby endorses a separate diving tank to be included in a multi-use aquatic facility in Red Deer, and forwards this to Council for consideration."
- 3. "Resolved that the Red Deer Multi-Use Aquatic Centre Review Committee, having considered the options for LEED Certification, hereby agrees to proceed on the basis that LEED shadow processes be achieved at a minimum."

- 4. "Resolved that the Red Deer Multi-Use Aquatic Centre Review Ad Hoc Committee, having discussed a location for a multi-use aquatic facility, hereby endorses the Rotary Recreation Park site for a multi-use aquatic centre in Red Deer, and forwards this to Council for consideration."
- 5. "Resolved that the Red Deer Multi-Use Aquatic Centre Review Committee, having considered cost estimates for the multi use aquatic facility, hereby endorses an estimated total amount of \$74.65 M, which includes the 2013 estimated cost of \$71.15 M for the recommended indoor facility and the \$3.5 M estimated cost of the recommended outdoor pool. This does not include any green features or LEED principles."
- 6. "Resolved that the Red Deer Multi-Use Aquatic Centre Review Committee, hereby recommends that the Red Deer multi-use aquatic facility be built to meet the FINA standards for national competitions. Note: FINA (Fédération Internationale de Natation) standards will allow the proposed facility to compete for provincial and national competitions.

Further, the Committee puts forward the following recommendations:

- I. Phasing. Based on costing information presented to the Committee, construction phasing is not recommended as a fiscally responsible or cost effective option for the proposed aquatic facility.
- 2. Michener Centre. The Committee strongly expressed that The City of Red Deer cannot afford to lose the existing aquatic facilities of the Michener Centre. As well, the Committee recommended that The City of Red Deer should pursue all avenues to keep the Michener Aquatic Centre open and maintain it as an aquatic facility, and should consider the pursuit of partnerships and/or a potential "gifting" of the facility from the Province.

Finally, the term of this Committee continues for the remainder of the 2014 calendar year, which, if required by City Council, may allow the Committee to address the final two points of the Terms of Reference. These two points are:

- Make recommendation to Council on alternative revenue opportunities that contribute to the development cost
- Explore existing operational agreements and/or partnerships

Further direction by Council on these points is requested.

The following chart takes into consideration all of the public and council input to find aligning priorities. It must be noted that the amenities required for the Canada Winter Games are committed projects in the 10 Year Capital Plan as Red Deer was successful in the bid for the 2019 games. However, for the purpose of this exercise these amenities were ranked along with all others and shown no priority. The amenities required for the Canada Winter Games are noted with symbol in the left column.

The Community Voice was measured by combining all of the public feedback and awarding one (I) point each time an amenity was mentioned. Community voice was determined to be a priority criteria by residents and Council when making a decision about amenities.

The Council Criteria Rankings were chosen by the public as the top three out of seven potential lenses through which the amenities could be ranked. Council then applied these lenses when examining each amenity, giving one (I) point for fully supporting the criteria, two (2) for partial support or insufficient information, and three (3) points for not meeting the criteria. The three decision making criteria that both residents and council determined to be priorities when making decisions about amenities are Social Investment, Economic Opportunity and Amenity Utilization.

Development Time Preferences were awarded one point per vote for each councillor.
